WHAT'S A KINDLE?

A Kindle holds 1500 books, and has a special screen that emits no light and is easy on the eyes. You can add comments, look up words in its dictionary, and even have it read a book to you out loud. Sorry, no Catalan translations just yet!



TOP 10 TIPS FOR USING THE KINDLE

- 1 **Turn on/off** using switch at the top edge, **Hold** 15 seconds to reset Kindle
- 2 **Get to the list of books** by hitting the HOME button on the right
- 3 **Move the cursor/highlight** around by moving the Joystick up/dwn/left/rt
- 4 **Select something** by pushing the Joystick in
- 5 **Move through the book** using PREV PAGE and NEXT PAGE buttons
- 6 **See the definition of a word** by moving the Joystick to the word
- 7 **Search**, go to Table of Contents, go to a Location using the MENU button
- 8 **Create a note** or select text by pushing the Joystick in
- 9 **Change the text size** using the AA key next to the space bar
- 10 Finally, explore the **Kindle Store** under the MENU button, have fun!
